Challenge and Opportunity, Your Voice Matters!

s we approach the coming year, upcoming events such as the 85th Texas Legislative Session which meets in January and the national Presidential elections in November, have the potential to affect our practice and the type of care our patients receive. On the state legislative front, funding for public mental health, the shortage of psychiatrists and scope of practice challenges from non-physician mental health professionals will most assuredly resurface. The question of what is next for Texas with our high rate of uninsured citizens and the decision not to expand Medicaid will need to be addressed.

Will there be a "Texas Solution "put forth to expand Medicaid coverage? If no decision is made on Medicaid our public system could face the double whammy of loss of 1115A Medicaid waiver Delivery System Reform Incentive Payments (DSRIP) and diminished capacity to collect third party revenue from an ever expanding uninsured patient base. DSRIP funds currently finance over \$2 billion dollars' worth of health care initiatives across the state, almost a quarter of these funds are for behavioral health care projects. The five year waiver is due to expire in December 2017 unless an extension is granted by the federal government.

Although MH funding has fared well in the past few legislative sessions, Texas still ranks at or near the bottom of the fifty states in overall mental health care spending. However in this session lawmakers face significantly reduced surplus tax revenue due to the downturn in the oil and gas industry.

The national Presidential election will impact the above in major ways. Depending on which party wins the election either the Affordable Care Act (ACA) will be dismantled or continued. Will another health care plan replace the ACA, or will we revert back to the previous healthcare system? The regulation of medical practice could increase or decrease depending on the outcome of the presidential and congressional races.

Increasingly the state public mental health system is becoming more and more of a forensic system whereby forensic commitments have outpaced civil commitments to our state hospitals. In our larger counties the county jails serve more people with Mental Illness than our state hospitals combined. This situation has diverted spending in many counties from more community based resources to jail based services favoring treatment for patients who are incarcerated, at the expense of mental health treatment services in the community.

Inpatient hospital beds are in short supply resulting in overcrowded hospital emergency departments of patients with mental illness boarding in these facilities often for days awaiting an inpatient psychiatric bed. This overcrowding of creates a public health crisis in that it delays care for other medical emergencies needing attention as well.

There is also a lack of short, intermediate and long term residential care facilities that afford a protective environment along with supportive therapeutic and psychiatric interventions. This lack of residential beds contributes to overuse of hospital beds as a less restrictive treatment level alternative does not exist. This situation is especially true for children and families who may not require hospital care but are unable to safely return home

In addition to the above, the way in which psychiatrists deliver care is also changing. The Collaborative Care Model (CCM) is becoming more the preferred model in which psychiatrists will deliver care in the private practice setting. We will become more consultants to primary care physicians and medical care systems with service being delivered in combined psychiatric primary care settings. Although the reimbursement for the psychiatrists practicing within this model has not been totally worked out, many Community Mental Health Centers, (CMHC) have established some forms of co-location and CCM initiatives. Many of our psychiatric training programs offer CCM rotations as a part of residency training.

These challenges are enough to discourage even the most optimistic among us. However where there are challenges there are also opportunities. What a great time to become involved in TSPP!! If you are not already a member of TSPP and APA and wish to join, please visit www.psych.org and download a membership application. Becoming a dues paying member gives our profession strength in numbers which gives us more clout in the legislature for passage of bills that ensure quality care of our patients and protect the professional practice of psychiatry. Our TSPP staff and legislative liaisons work very closely with the Texas Medical Association who have been

quite supportive of our initiatives as they align with the interests of all physicians.

During the legislative session Our TSPP staff monitors all legislative bills pertaining to psychiatric practice and patient care. TSPP arranges for members to provide input to legislative committees and also talk with bill sponsors often resulting in the bill being rewritten or tweaked to a more favorable outcome.

TSPP membership also gives the opportunity for our members to serve on one of its many committees that encompass education, practice and service. Your voice and influence on these committees can lead to significant improvements on both the local and national level as action items are developed to influence change at the local and national level through the APA. TSPP membership provides the opportunity to meet and get to know colleagues from across the state to exchange ideas and experiences. According to the WHO depression is one of the most prevalent serious brain disorders and the primary cause of disability in the world. There is a gap in knowledge of the mechanisms involved in neuroinflammation and depression and the specific triggers involved to avoid in neuroinflammation. Cell mediated immune response, inflammatory and oxidative stress pathways and their sequlae play a role in the pathophysicology of depression.

There have been a small number of studies indicating the use of botulinum toxin may be an alternative means of treatment for some depressed patients. Though larger studies are needed, the use of botulinum toxin is emerging as a potential treatment modality for patients with major depressive disorder.

Professional practice gap: This session addresses the risks and benefits of prescribing psychotropic medications during pregnancy. Recent literature has been conflicting at times regarding the relative safety of antidepressants during pregnancy and the potential outcomes for teratogenic effects and development. Other medications such as antipsychotics and mood stabilizers have differing levels of teratogenic effects and are often considered in the context of poorly controlled schizophrenia or bipolar illness in pregnancy.

The activity is designed to enhance the knowledge of participants in the relative risks and benefits of psychotropic medication use in pregnancy, treatment alternatives, and the risk of uncontrolled psychosis and mood disorders.

Professional practice gap: Ethical practice and research in psychiatry continues to be challenging with emerging biotechnologies, funding challenges, and conflicting ethical principles. This presentation will discuss commonly encountered ethical challenges, prioritizing ethical principles, and how and when to seek ethics consultation in practice and research.


