## Federation Comes Together for Relief Efforts

ugust 25, 2017 Hurricane Harvey made landfall near Corpus Christi; by August 30 Houston was impacted. And all of us know the unprecedented event of flooding Houston sustained. All eyes were upon Houston as we watched the bravery of Texans helping Texans during this catastrophe. Physicians stepped up all across Texas, and other states, to give aid to Houston. Doctors worked in Houston hospitals, staying in the hospitals for days to care for patients in spite of knowing their own homes were most likely underwater. Relief efforts were organized in Texas cities; Austin, San Antonio, Dallas, and Fort Worth took in refugees and staffed facilities which included physician volunteers. Houston physicians mobilized within days of the flooding and staffed the George R. Brown Convention Center, at peak housing more than 10,000 people and the NRG Center more than 2,000 people, to help those impacted. Psychiatrist members assisted in those relief efforts in coordination with colleagues from our county medical societies and hospitals. And, the lessons learned from the Hurricane Katrina relief efforts helped tremendously in addressing Hurricane Harvey's aftermath as many had plans in place to assist those impacted.

The Federation of Texas Psychiatry kept members updated throughout the events happening by providing live online links to resources to assist the members, their practice, or others in need in securing services and disaster relief, in addition to providing coping and care services for their patients. live inks, information and resources available to now assist in both personal and professional disaster recovery efforts.

Texas Medical Association, one of the Federation of Texas Psychiatry's member organizations, also kept Texas doctors updated throughout the events happening. **The TMA website, www.texmed.org currently has information available for physicians whose practices were impacted in the hurricane area in which those doctors can apply for financial assistance to aid rebuilding their practice.** 

The American Psychiatric Association, and the Louisiana District Branch, reached out to the Texas Society of Psychiatric Physicians with information about mental health assistance in disasters. In addition, APA approved awarding the Lindemann Grant to TSPP for use in helping to fund recovery efforts that TSPP is engaged in with the members.

The mental health fallout from Hurricane Harvey will present itself long after Houston is rebuilt from this trauma. We psychiatrists will be the people who will be asked to help those struggling – and we will step up to the challenge. Organized psychiatry is here to help all of us in these efforts.
